Seniors Decide 2016 Forum

The nation's only presidential candidate forum focused on issues important to our nation's older adults is tomorrow

Seniors Decide 2016 is a forum developed by the [Leadership Council of Aging Organizations](#) to share the views of Presidential candidates on policies and programs affecting older Americans. Invitations were sent to presidential candidates of both parties to join a national conversation about issues important to seniors and their families. More than 1,000 Americans have sent in questions for candidates participating in tomorrow's forum, plus voters in 40 states nationwide will be hosting more than 125 viewing parties to watch the event live-streamed. Democratic and Republican pollsters will also present their findings on what is driving seniors' voting decisions in 2016.
